❖ **Induction Loop** hearing aid users can set their devices to use this in the nave of church.

I saw water flowing from the right side of the temple. Alleluia!

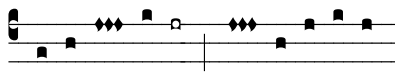
COLLECT
